Background and context

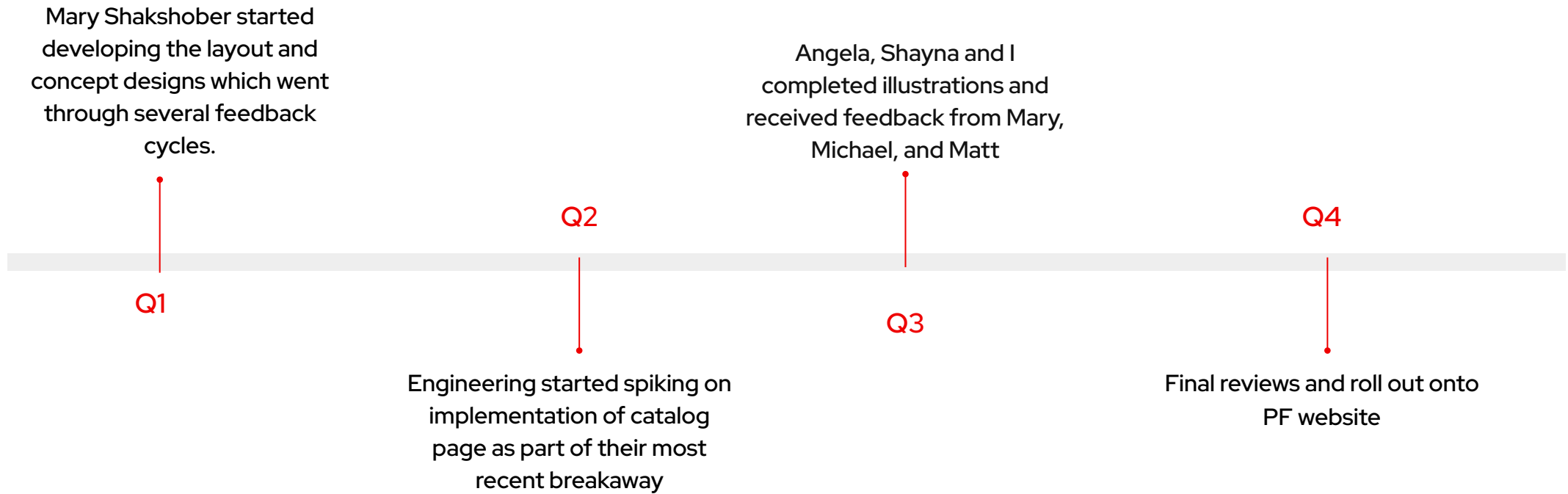
Goal statement

Why?

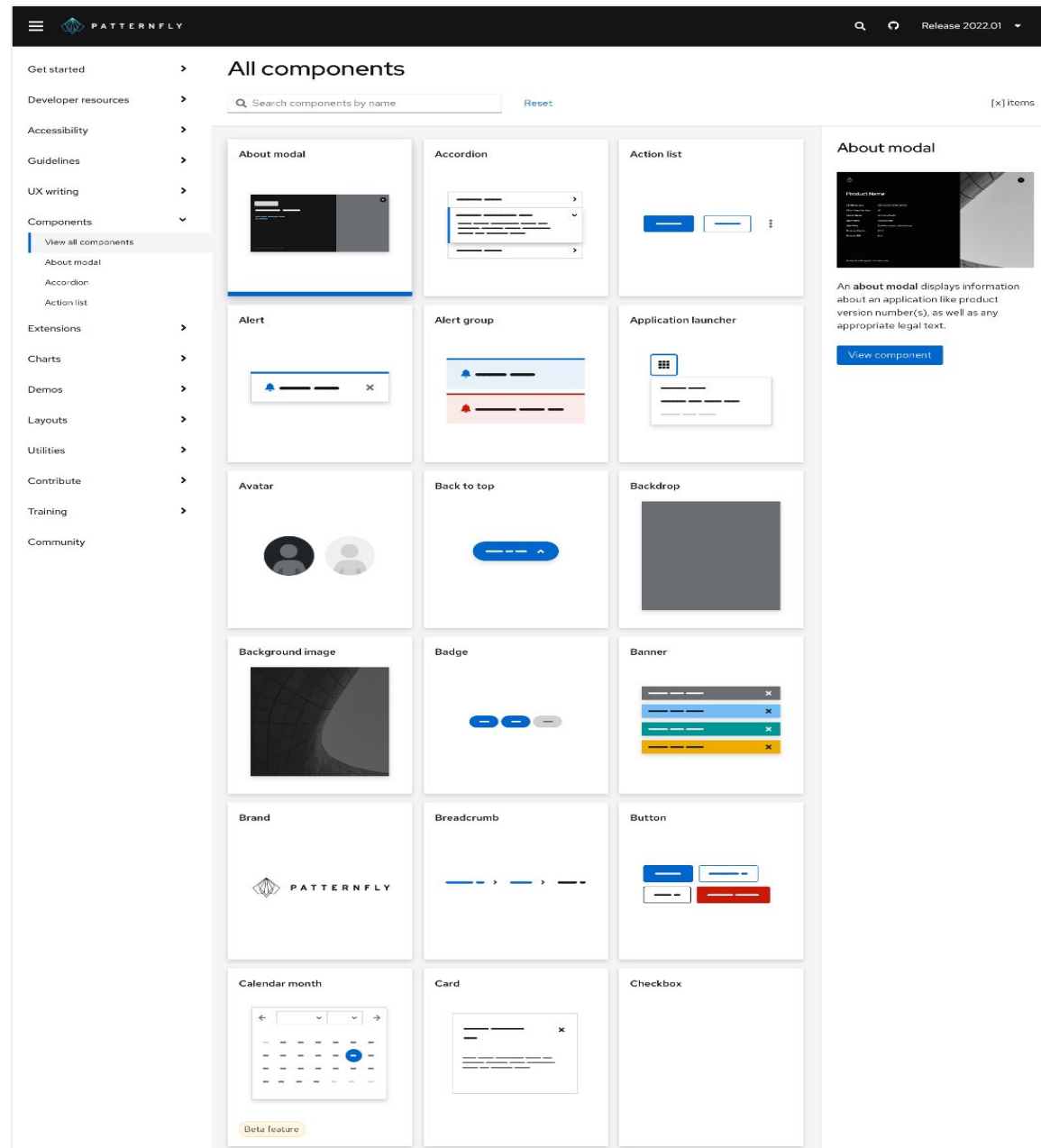
- ▶ We recognize that different design systems call components different names. For example, what we call a 'label' other systems might call a "lozenge"

Ensuring consistency

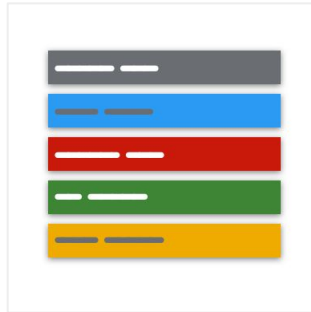
- ▶ Font: flow text or lorem ipsum
